Computing



Children will create their very own holiday e-card using ICT. Also, they will plan and present a meteorological report using technology. Computing will also be included within all subjects, with some lessons delivered through Google Classroom.

<u>Maths</u>

In Maths we will aim to master:

- Area and perimeter
- Money

<u>Science</u>

We are learning about 'Animals including humans'. We will explore:

- The functions and parts of the human digestive system
- The different types of teeth in humans and their simple functions.
 Our second topic, 'Electricity', will cover:
- constructing a simple electrical circuit, identifying its basic parts
- identifying whether or not a lamp will light in a simple series circuit
- recognise that a switch opens and closes a circuit and associate this with whether or not a lamp lights in a simple series circuit.

R.E. - We will be looking at what happens when Muslims/Sikhs get married. We will also learn about local religions with the focus on Islam.

PSHE - Our topics will be 'Relationships' and 'Changes', helping children understand themselves and others.

Home Learning

Homework is a continuation of school work and is a great opportunity for your child to practise the skills they have learnt. **Reading** - For the children to progress in their reading, they need to read aloud daily. Please write a short comment in their reading log to communicate to us how they are reading at home.

Spellings - Weekly spellings should be practised at home daily using the Read, Write, Look, Cover, Check strategy.

English - Please check your child's homework book. Homework will relate to the unit of work for that week. We expect the same high standard of writing produced in a lesson.
