Year 6 Trip to Lille

Salut! From 15th - 18th May, Mrs Cowan, along with 16 students and four members of staff, had the opportunity to visit Lille, a major city in north-eastern France. The educational visit was designed to provide maximum educational benefits as well as an opportunity to learn about another culture, language and lifestyle.

We stayed in an area known as "Vieille Lille" which is particularly attractive. Its 17th century houses have a particularly Flemish style and the buildings often have colourful facades. They give a fascinating introduction to the architecture of the town.

The highlight of our visit was The battlefield of Fromelles, this was one of the landmarks where the students were very inquisitive and had shown great interest in finding out about the first attack which took place by the Australian forces in France during the Great War of 1914-1918. We also visited Lille Museum of Fine Arts Palais des Beaux-Arts which is the second most popular museum in France where we viewed a wide selection of paintings covering all art-forms and most artists from the 15th - 20th century.

The students enjoyed tasting the French cuisine and had a great shopping experience using Euros.



The educational visit to Lille was a remarkable and enjoyable experience. The students demonstrated an excellent use of their French language. This is an experience we will cherish for the rest of our lives!
