English



Writing - In Autumn 1, our English units will mainly link in with Greek myths. We will be:

- Reading a range of Greek myths and identify the features found in myths;
- Writing our own myth involving natural phenomena, gods and fantasy creatures.

In Autumn 2, our English Unit will link with our focus book Charles Dickens' 'A Christmas Carol'. We will be:

- Write our own creative version of the story using a range of punctuation, ambitious vocabulary and different sentence structures.

Reading - Our focus text in Autumn 1 is Percy Jackson, The Lightning Thief written by Rick Riordan. In Autumn 2, we will read Wonder by R.J Palacio.

During Guided Reading the children will:

- Develop fluency by exploring different reading strategies;
- Improve their comprehension skills using Reciprocal Reading to deepen understanding.

Computing



We will start the year looking at online safety. We will explore different scenarios and provide strategies, rules and set boundaries to stay safe. Throughout the year we will continue to monitor and safeguard our pupils from potential danger.

Maths

In Maths we will aim to master:

- Number and place value;
- Addition and subtraction;
- Multiplication and division;
- A range of problem solving opportunities.

Children must go home and practice what they learn in class. They must also learn their times tables off by heart up to 12x12.



Science

Our first topic is 'Living things and their habitat'. We will learn to:

- Describe how living things are classified into broad groups
- Give reasons for classifying plants and animals based on specific characteristics.

Our second topic will be 'Electricity'.

We will explore:

- Different components by constructing simple circuits
- Experiment with components
- Learn to use symbols.



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R.E/PSHE



R.E. - We will learn about how different religions and world views create celebrations.
PSHE - The topic 'New Beginnings' offers children the opportunity to see themselves as valued individuals within a community, and how to contribute to shaping a welcoming, safe and fair learning community for all.

English - Please check your child's homework book. Homework will relate to the unit of work for that week. We expect a high standard of writing, the same as we would expect in a lesson.
