This has been an exceptionally exciting week at school with workshops, educational visits, swimming and visitors from partner schools abroad.



Erasmus Project

This week, we had the pleasure of welcoming our Erasmus partner teachers and students from 4 different countries: Ireland, Spain, Romania and Greece. The project is called 'Unlocking Limits Together' and the theme is 'Diversity and Inclusion'.



On Monday, our special visitors were introduced to the whole school and given a tour around the building. They were overwhelmed with how big the school is and how diverse the students and teachers are. Pupils from Essex Primary School and the partner schools spent time getting to know each other, learning a song about unity in a range of different languages. While the students enjoyed taking part in an after school activity, teachers attended training about our inclusion approach.

Throughout the week, we visited a range of places of worship - all in walking distance from the school. We went to a church, mosque, temple and a gurdwara. Our guests found the visits very informative, as they were able to learn more about other religions. The pupils took part in a carousel of sensory deprivation activities which they thoroughly enjoyed. We played games on diversity and inclusion, including a kahoot and an activity called 'what would you do?' Meanwhile, the teachers had training on etwinning. Pupils created masks using different media to represent diversity. Together, we enjoyed a day out in the good weather, visiting famous London landmarks such as Big Ben and Buckingham palace; the day ended with a river cruise. Both pupils and staff were intrigued by the unique architecture we have in the UK. Today, we held an assembly where our guests shared their week with the rest of the school and received certificates as well as souvenir presents.



Fairplay House Educational Visit

On Wednesday 9th March, some of our pupils with special educational needs went on a day visit to Fairplay House, Outdoor Activity Centre in Essex which is owned by Newham. Many of the pupils understood that they were



going on a visit and were very excited. They travelled from school by minibus, arriving at Fairplay House at 10:30am in the glorious sunshine. The staff and pupils were greeted by the instructors, who set out some soft play equipment for the pupils to explore.



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Activities included the 'High Ropes', 'Zip Wire' and 'Low Ropes Course'. It was so lovely to see how much more confident and independent the pupils became throughout the day.

It was an absolute pleasure to take the pupils to Fairplay House and see how much they blossomed throughout the day. The instructors were very impressed with them and with what they had achieved.
