

Holiday learning

During your time at home, please continue to use the resources and strategies that you have been provided with by the school.

Adapt the ideas below to meet the needs of your child. This will ensure your child continues to make progress and is ready to move on with their learning when they return to school.

- Use communication resources and strategies consistently e.g. Core Vocabulary Board (if your child has one), signing, gestures, clear simple language
- Support children with transitioning e.g. from one place or activity to another. Prepare children for these changes using clear, simple language, pictures, objects
- Read with your child and talk about the pictures together.
- Maths activities
 - counting (e.g. counting cars)
 - finding shapes in the environment
 - time (e.g. morning, afternoon, night)
 - money (finding coins to buy an item from a toy shop at home)
- Playing games
 - working on taking turns, waiting, listening, looking
- Keep to routines as far as possible (especially bedtime routines)
