Non-chronological reports

Does anyone know what a non-chronological report is?

Non-chronological reports don't have to be read in **any order**.

Features of a non-chronological report:

Introduction -
What is the report about?

Sub-headings -
Separate your information.

Paragraphs -
Facts about your topic.

Present Tense -
Imagine it is happening
now.

Third Person -
Use he, she, it, etc.

Pictures/Diagrams -
What does it look like?

Today, you are going to be writing the second part of your report. To do this you will use your fact sheet. You will be writing about the animal's young.

Young means *child, baby*.



Animals can reproduce and have babies. They lay eggs or they carry their babies. Mammals carry their babies within their wombs, where as other types of animals lay eggs.

How do we write about the animals young?

The subheading for animals young

- Write if the animal lays eggs or carries the baby
- Write some facts about the young
- Describe how the young look.



For example:

Leopards carry their babies. Baby leopards are called cubs. By ten days old their eyes open and their spots begin to show.

Remember:

- To use capital letters, full stops and adjectives to make your writing more interesting..
- Remember to use conjunctions to add more information.
