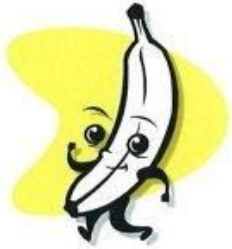
CARROTS

Make my favourite snack to eat.



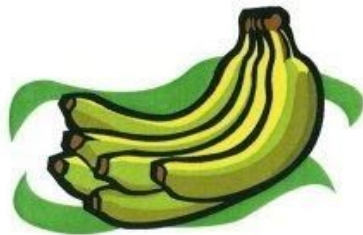
Lovely bananas
