LO: To write a animal poem (part 2)

What is poetry?

Poetry is written by a poet.

When a poet writes a poem, they try to get you to use your imagination or feelings, when you are reading it. They do this by thinking about what words mean and how they sound. The poet might change the order of words to make them sound a certain way.

Can you name some features in a poem?

Today we are going to use our plans to write the second stanza of our animal poem. We will be including the words from our plans to create a fun, imaginative poem!

Each class will be focusing on an animal from a different animal group.

1R - Mammals

1A - Reptiles

1N - Fish

1K - Birds

What do we need to do?

Using the plan from the yesterday, you will be writing the second stanza. The second stanza must be of the second animal from your animal group. Include both examples of the rhyming couplets to create a four line stanza!

For example:

Animal	Part of the animal	Adjective	Rhyming word
Elephant	legs	grey	away
Elephant	skin	rough	tough

Elephant's legs hairy and grey,
Helps them run and get away.

Elephant's skin so dry and tough,
When you touch it, it feels hard and rough.

Now complete your second stanza! Remember to include rhyming couplets.
