LO: To write a animal poem (part 1)

What is poetry?

Poetry is written by a poet.

When a poet writes a poem, they try to get you to use your imagination or feelings, when you are reading it. They do this by thinking about what words mean and how they sound. The poet might change the order of words to make them sound a certain way.

Can you name some features in a poem?

Can you tell the adult what rhyming words are?

**Do rhyming words end with the same letters or
sound?**

Write some examples of rhyming words.

Today we are going to use our plans to write the first stanza of our animal poem. We will be including the words from our plans to create a fun, imaginative poem!

Each class will be focusing on an animal from a different animal group.

1R - Mammals

1A - Reptiles

1N - Fish

1K - Birds

What do we do first?

Using the plan from the yesterday, you will be writing the first stanza. Include both examples of the rhyming couplets to create a four line stanza!

For example:

Animal	Part of the animal	Adjective	Rhyming word
Monkey	tail	long	strong
Monkey	smile	cheeky	sneaky

The furry monkey's tail so long,
Often hanging from it because it is strong.
The monkey's smile is very cheeky,
Hiding bananas and being sneaky.

Now complete your first stanza! Remember to include rhyming couplets.
