

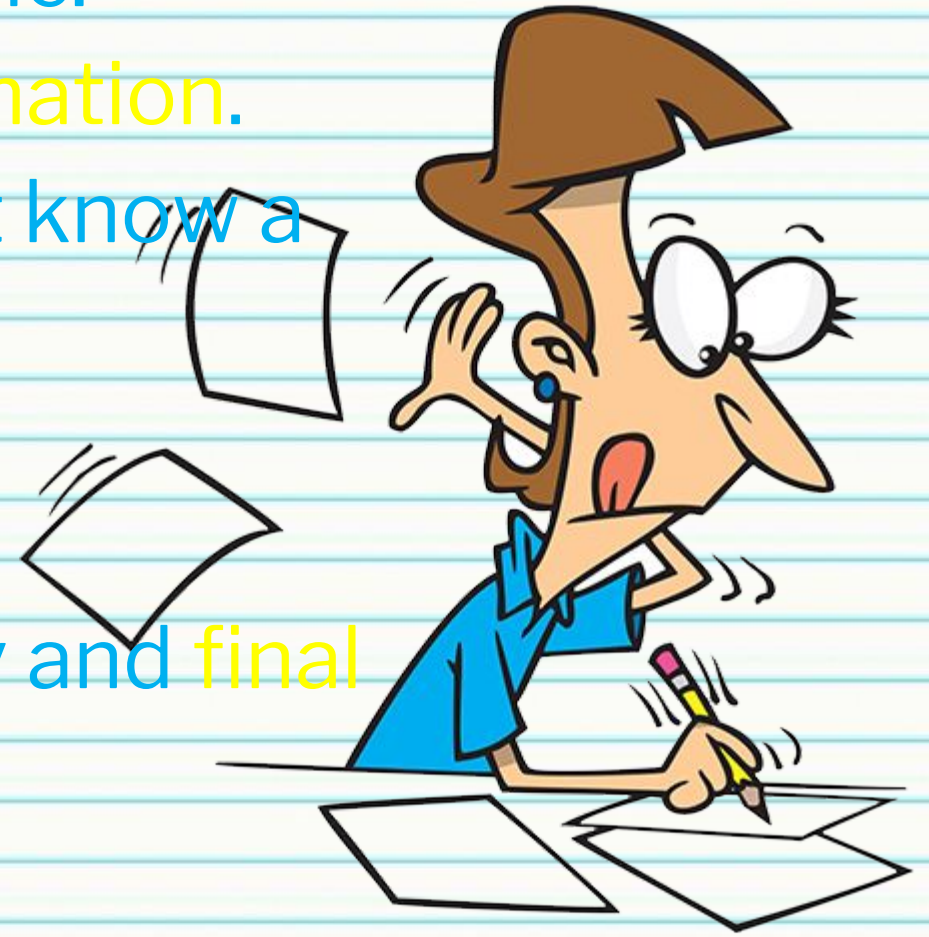

Non-chronological reports

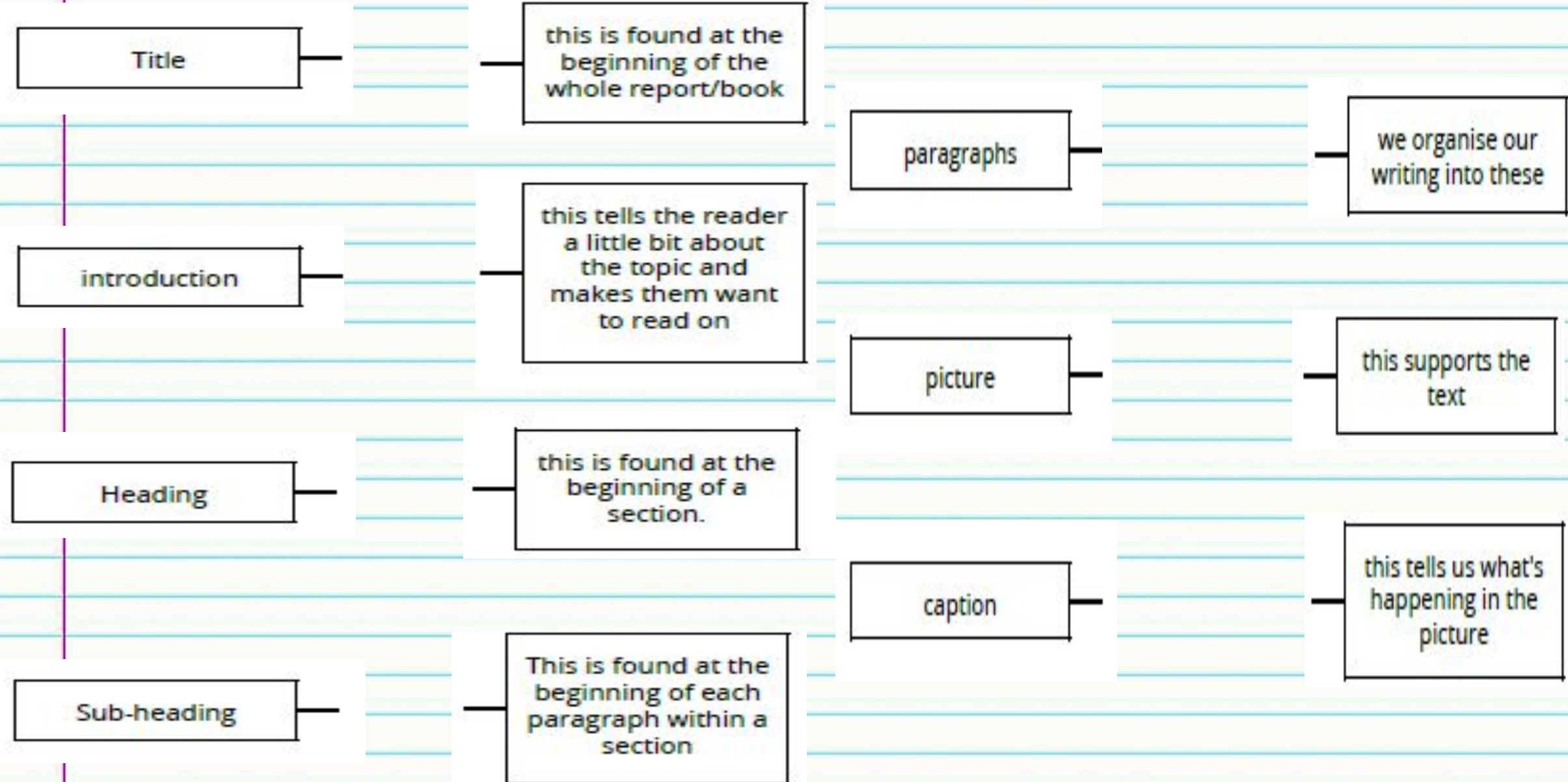
Does anyone know what a non-chronological report is?

Purpose:

- Non-chronological reports don't have to be read in **any order**.
- Aim to give us information on a topic.
- Written to give other people **information**.
- Useful for **studying** things we don't know a lot about.
- Written in **paragraphs**.
- Contain an **introduction, main body and final paragraph**.
- Reports contain specific **features**.

You can include:

- What is the UK?
- Where is the UK?
- How many countries make the UK? What are they called?
- What surrounds the UK?
- The different types of weather in the UK?

- What is the capital city?
- List and describe the famous landmarks and places
- What famous foods are there in England?
- Famous festivals
- What language is spoken in England?
