




Terrific Tuesday 16/6/20

Dear Parent/Carer,

The Nursery team hope that you and your children are safe and well. Here are some ideas and suggestions for a great day with your child. Choose your favourite 3 or do more and if you can, take some photos to share.

What's my name? (suggested time 10-15 minutes max)

- Using the pegs you made yesterday, can you peg up your name.
- Then can you practise writing your name on the outside floor with chalk or on a large piece of paper.
- How many times can you write your name in 3 minutes?
- Which letters do you need to work on?



Wake and Shake! (Suggested time 10 minutes max)




- Watch the Boogie Beebies clip below

- What movements can you do? The focus is being a penguin!
- Can you follow the instructions?
- Can you sing along to the song?
- Ask some family members to join in with you!

Alphabet Museum! (Suggested time 10 minutes max)

- Create a DIY showcase with some cardboard boxes and write a big letter in the middle of each one of them.
- Get your child to look for various, small items in your house or outside to place in a box corresponding to the letter they begin with.
- This activity can be a long lasting game if you change the 'exhibition' every now and then or move the boxes around.



Literacy (Suggested time 15 minutes)



- We are looking at a story called 'My Mother's Sari.'
- Listen to the youtube clip of the story again.

- After watching the story, can you discuss with an adult what the characters did with the sari?
 - How many different ways did they use the sari?
 - How else could you use the sari?



Snack/Lunch (15 minutes)

- Can you make an owl toast! Lightly toast the slice of bread
- Once cooled slightly, spread on the chocolate spread.
- Carefully place a banana onto the chocolate spread. Use them to make two big eyes.
- Put a dab of chocolate spread onto 2 blueberries and place them in the centre of each slice of banana, to complete the eye.
- Place a strawberry below the eyes, in the centre of the toast, to make the beak.
- Slice an apple to make the wings. Place them at an angle on either side of the toast, with the curved edges facing.
- Encourage your child to follow the step by step instructions.



Playtime




- Visit and log onto the website: <https://www.busythings.co.uk/play/#>

- What activity did you do? What sounds did you make? Did it sound nice?

Topic Activity (15 minutes)



- Focusing on the story 'My Mother's Sari'. The boy says 'My Mother's sari is long like a train'.
- Using whatever resources you like, can you make a train using fabric around the house?
- You could use scarves, pillows, throws, clothes etc.
- Encourage your child to tell the process of making their train.
- What have you used? What is a train? When did you last go on a train?

Storytime



- Today choose a non-fiction book to read.
- Non fiction books are based on real facts.
- Choose a topic you are interested about and get your adult to read a book on that.
- Can you tell your adult 3 key facts you now know?
- It could be about animals, places, trains etc.
