English



We will be learning about stories with familiar settings, writing about the setting and story of Amazing Grace who discovers that she can achieve her dreams through self belief and dedication. We will read poems inspired by the Caribbean poet, John Agard, and creating our own pattern poems. We will be writing instructions and this will be linked with the D&T project to design a healthy pizza. Later in the term we will be writing texts about Mary Seacole and Florence Nightingale and this will be linked to the work in History (The lives of significant individuals and figures from British Black History). We will also create our own version of the Kenyan village folk tale, Mama Panya's Pancakes. Reading - During Guided Reading children will focus on



- Developing different reading strategies
- Improving their comprehension skills using Reciprocal Reading to deepen understanding

They will be taught to

- Provide evidence from the text
- Make sensible predictions
- Clarify meanings
- Summarise texts Speak Up

We are continuing to promote Standard English in both speaking and writing by learning and performing a poem every half term.



Home Learning

Homework will be set on Google Classroom. We would like you to continue listening to your child read and sharing books with them daily as well as completing preparation for the weekly spelling test following the Look Write Cover Check approach. We will be checking reading records weekly and look forward to seeing your comments every week. There will also be a poem sent home for your child to learn by heart for their school performance.

Mathematics

In Year 2, we will be continuing with 'Maths No Problem'. This year, there is a focus on teaching Maths for mastery which means children will use concrete objects then pictorial models before abstract concepts. This is designed to improve the Maths confidence of children of all abilities. The whole class works through the programme at the same pace with sufficient time on each topic before moving on. For advanced learners, the textbooks contain more challenging questions for pupils to develop their higher-order thinking skills. This term we will be learning about place value, numbers to 100, addition and subtraction calculations, multiplication and division, length and mass.

Computing

This term our focus is on online safety. Children will be focusing on the potential dangers of the internet and finding ways to stay safe following the SMART approach. Also, the children will use Word and the Internet to research relevant information on the topics taught.





Science

The children will learn about humans and animals:

They will learn about that adults have offspring which grow into adults.

- They will find out about and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival (water, food and air)
- They will describe the importance for humans to exercise
- They will also learn about different



types of food groups and the need for a balanced diet. The focus scientist will be David Attenborough and the contribution he has made to our understanding of Natural History.



Music

This term we will be focusing on rhythmic patterns. Our musician of the term will be Florence Prince, who was the first black woman to impact classical music. To commemorate her, we will innovate a piece of her music and create the 'sounds of the windrush'.

ngredients inspired by the way people customize recipes according to their cultures and traditions. During the Festival of Remembrance children will explore the work of Georgia O'Keeffe and create their own poppy inspired paintings using water colour.



History

Our topic will focus on the lives of significant others. We will study the contribution made to Britain by Mary Seacole, a Jamaican-born nurse who cared for wounded British soldiers during the Crimean War,



focusing on how she impacted the lives of others during a time of racial inequality. We will compare her life to Florence Nightingale and discover how they both inspired others.



Geography

We will be learning about the human and physical geography of London in comparison with Lagos, Nigeria focusing on climate, governance and everyday life in these contrasting capital cities.



RE/PSHCE

R.E. - We will be looking at 'What is fasting?' The unit will look at all religious groups that fast and explore the reasons why.

PSHCE - The theme of 'New Beginnings' offers children the opportunity to see themselves as valued individuals within a community, and to contribute to a safe and fair learning community for all.
