Get the whole family to join in! If you want to do more than one activity, that's fine too. Most importantly, **have fun with it!**



<p>Nature art Pick some leaves, petals and other objects from outside. Turn them into a piece of art.</p> 	<p>Draw a picture of an animal Talk about different animals. Can you draw a picture of your favourite animal?</p> 	<p>Name writing Practise writing your name. Try different colours to make it interesting. Ask for a letter formation sheet if you need it.</p> 
<p>Sing-a-long Teach a family member one of the songs we sing at nursery. Do you know any songs about animals?</p> 	<p>Healthy Snack Find a recipe for a healthy snack. Make it at home and take a photograph to share with the other children.</p> 	<p>Dinner time Help to set the table for dinner. Talk about what the utensils are called (knife, fork, spoon), how we use them, and where they go (left/right).</p> 
<p>Scavenger hunt Think of different things you might find outside (flowers, leaves, stones). Go on a hunt to find some of the objects then sort and count them.</p> 	<p>Read a story Share your child's favourite story. Can you read a story about an animal? What animal was in the story?</p> 	<p>Animals Talk to your family about different animals. What is your favourite animal? What does it look like?</p> 


Zoo Animals Count and Colour

Count and colour the animals. Colour the circle with the correct number of animals.




Three flamingos are shown in a row. To their right are three circles containing the numbers 3, 5, and 8.




Two elephants are shown in a row. To their right are three circles containing the numbers 6, 1, and 2.
