Mother Language day

The day culminated in a whole school assembly led by Ms McKenzie where pupils and staff from different countries spoke to share their mother tongue. Pupils sang, shared pieces of writing, demonstrated conversations and taught words and phrases in other languages. It was amazing to see how diverse our community is.



Year 6 Visit to Parliament

This week, year 6 were fortunate enough to visit the Houses of Parliament, where they were given a guided tour of the building by an extremely knowledgeable individual called Jay (who long ago completed work experience at Essex Primary School; this is probably why he was able to be so informative!). The pupils learned all kinds of things, from the process of voting, debates in the House of Lords and that King Henry VIII was the last monarch to live in the building (he used the Great Hall for games of tennis and beheadings!) Pupils came away with aspirations to be the next statue installed in the building and in doing so, to break the trend of old white men being immortalised in marble. We are certain that they will succeed!



Junior RE Conference

On Thursday, 6 students from year 5 attended the Junior RE Conference at Elmhurst Primary School. They were joined by students from many other schools in Newham and took part in a range of activities. They started off with some warm up games to introduce themselves to each other, followed by a story discussion. Pupils took part in a big P4C discussion which they led, coming up with some fantastic debates about what community means. They finished the day off with an arts and crafts activity, each designing a plastic egg with quotes, making a little basket and putting them together. Pupils loved the experience and gained a lot from the conference.
