

Computing

Pupils will continue working on computational thinking to develop their problem solving skills. They will use the interactive whiteboard to explore onscreen

effects of their actions.



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Understanding of the World

Pupils will go on a Mini-beast hunt in the Forest School area - they will explore animals and their habitats and discuss their diet and life cycle. They will learn about camouflage, similarities and differences in relation to other insects and talk about the features of the environment they live in.



Communication and Language

This term, pupils will interact with others in a variety of contexts, negotiating plans and activities, as well as taking turns in conversation.

They will learn to understand 'why' and 'how' questions as well as using talk to connect ideas, explain what is happening and anticipate what might happen next, recall or relive past experiences.

They will be encouraged to explore the meanings and sounds of new words, also speaking clearly with

confidence and control, showing awareness of the listener.





Music

Pupils will listen to a range of different types of music. They will continue to learn a range of different songs. They will be introduced to the concept of pitch through different games and activities. They will play and create their own music with their voices, instruments or through body percussion.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Through a range of teacher led and child initiated activities, pupils will develop their skills of playing co-operatively and listening to each others' views and opinions. They will develop confidence in expressing their own views and opinions. The importance of following class rules will continue to be embedded with pupils developing an awareness of how their behavior must adjust for

different situations.



Expressive Arts and Design

Pupils will use a range of media,

including paint, collage, papier mache, junk modelling and salt dough, to represent different parts of a

plant. They will use dance and music to further explore the sounds, sights and feelings created within each real or imaginary world. They will learn to represent their own ideas, thoughts and feelings through art and role-play.





Pupils will have daily phonics lessons, working within small phonics groups, following the stages of progression mapped out in our phonics program. Within the sessions, they will learn to link letters to their sounds to decode, read and write simple regular words by segmenting and blending these sounds. Each phonics session starts with the Alphabet Chant. Pupils will also learn some high frequency words in these sessions and apply their phonic knowledge to read and write simple sentences, eventually.
