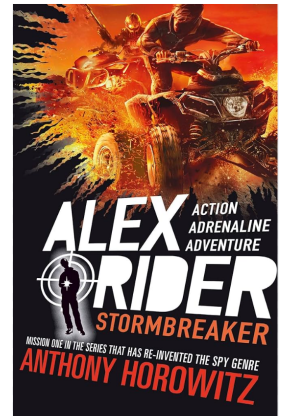


Year 6 Holiday Homework

English

For the history project, create a 3D model of a viking boat 'longship'. Be as creative as possible and remember to use recycled materials that you can find at home.
