#### Year 1 visit to the V&A Museum of Childhood

Pupils explored a range of old and new toys and used their knowledge from English and History lessons to identify how toys were the same and how they differed. It was amazing to see pupils recall what they have learned and apply this knowledge in real life. Pupils had the opportunity to see a variety of artefacts around the museum as well as participating in an engaging, immersive workshop. During the workshop, pupils became investigators and examined their fingerprints. Pupils practised the art skill of printing and created super pictures using their fingerprints.
