Primary Science Quality Mark

Langdon Academy Sport Partnership

Langdon Academy Sport Partnership Objectives

1. Improving the PE experience for every young person

We focus on helping schools to reach out to every young person by redesigning PE and school sport to engage those not currently engaged as well as driving improvements in providing a meaningful PE experience for young people with disabilities.

2. Using PE and sport to inspire learning and achievement

We will use the School Sport Partnership infrastructure, to raise standards in English, maths and science as well as improve behaviour, attendance and aspirations.

3. Enabling every young person to enjoy competition and providing support to the most talented

We work with National Governing Bodies of Sport and schools to widen the opportunity for young people to compete within, and between, schools. We have also been helping to put intra-competition back at the heart of schools.

4. Developing a new generation of coaches working in schools

We are developing a homegrown community based coaching team to work across the School Sport Partnership. This encourages schools to source high-quality coaches and deploys them both in sport and more widely across other areas of the school.

5. Connecting school and club sport

We work with schools and National Governing Bodies of Sport to establish new clubs on school's sites. This is not only addressing accessibility issues for young people (cost, location and culture), but it's also helping to 'open up' schools to their local community and providing access to potentially under-used facilities.

6. Supporting the development of young leaders and volunteers

We work in partnership with a number of School Sport Partnership across East London who host major sporting events to deploy our young leaders. We introduced peer leadership programmes that give every child an opportunity to lead.
