Reception Summer Holiday Homework - Preparing for Year 1





Over the summer holidays, we would like you to complete projects based on the topics that you will be learning about. As part of our Science topic in the Autumn Term, Year 1 will be learning about **Ourselves** and for History you will be learning about the **Local area**.

<u>Task 1 - ENGLISH:</u> Your task is to write a weekly diary about your Summer holidays. Every week, we would like you to write about:

- -What you did
- -How you felt
- -Who / Where you visited
- -You can draw a lovely picture and add your own labels.
- -Remember to include: capital letters, full stops and use your phonics to help you sound out your words.



Task 2 - LOCAL AREA PROJECT:

Your project is based on our local area. Your task is to go on a walk around our local area, Manor Park, and take pictures of what you can see. Create a profile/poster with different pictures or observational drawings and label what you saw and where it was located. Challenge: Can you say whether the places are newly built or many years old?

You can include pictures/drawings of: new and old library, flats/houses, restaurants, GP surgery, Dental practice, Chemist/Pharmacy, grocery shops, places of worship - Mosque/Church etc. You could also make a simple map of your local area.

Additional task: You could use a shoebox to create a model of your local community, including some of the places you like to visit. Use junk modelling to create the different buildings..

Make sure you visit your local library and choose some exciting books to read during the holiday. They often have fun activities to do at the library too.

Task 4 - MATHS:

Focus on one concept a week. Provide some examples of your learning for your teacher.

2D shapes:

- Create a picture using different 2D shapes
- Practice reading and writing numbers up to a least 20 (write them out in the correct order)
- Practice counting forward and backwards
- Number bonds to 10, for example 5 + 5 = 10 6+4 = 10 practice these with an adult at home
- If you know your number bonds to 10, practise your number bonds to 20 (try and use a part part whole or write them as a number sentence)
- Start learning to count in 2's, you can count your pairs of socks

Task 5 - SCIENCE- OURSELVES:

We will be learning all about 'Ourselves'. Your project includes creating a model of the human body. Label the different parts of the body and the five senses. You can use a range of materials available at home to help you make this model 3D.

Challenging thoughts: Will your model be of the inside or the outside of our human body?
