Science



The children will sit the Standard Attainment Tests (SATS) for reading, grammar, spelling and punctuation and mathematics in May. After the SATs the children will be assessed in writing and science by their teachers. Mock SATs week will be: 30th January - 3rd February. Revision books will be available to purchase at a reduced price from the school to support your child's studies.
